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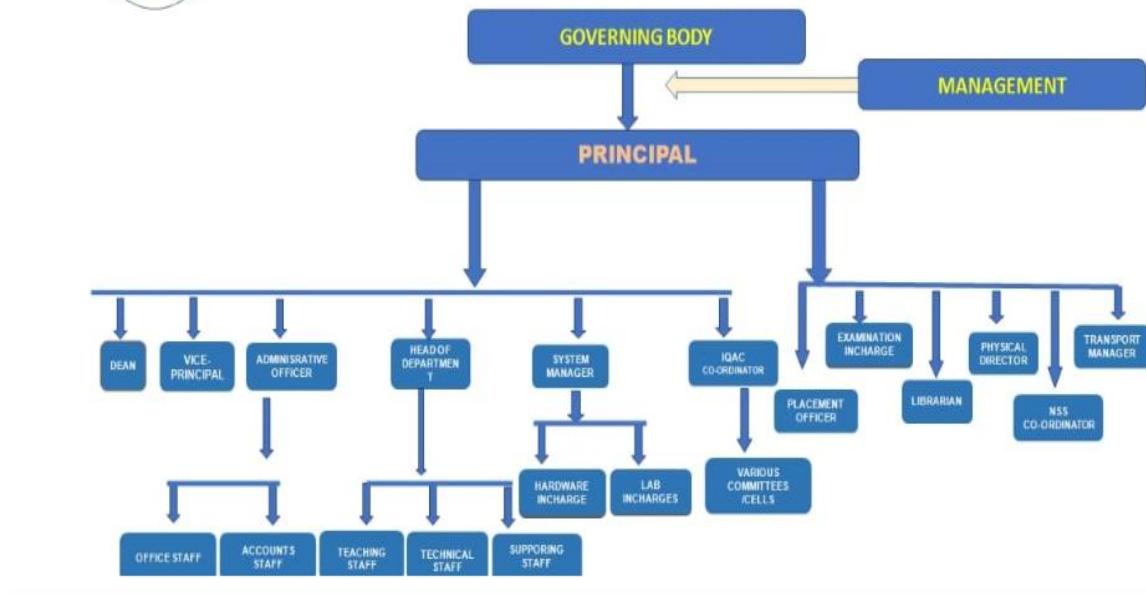

8. Grievance Redressel mechanism for faculty,

Staff and Students The College is committed to provide a congenial, fair and harmonious learning and working environment in the institution for the students. Grievance redressal Cell was set up at KIST, Nellore for providing Mechanisms for receiving, processing and addressing dissatisfaction expressed, complaints received and other formal requests made by students, staff and other stakeholders in the institutional provisions promised and perceived. 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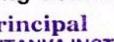

In India, the terms Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST), and Other Backward Classes (OBC) refer to specific categories of communities identified for affirmative action. These classifications stem from historical injustices and social discrimination faced by these groups, and they play a crucial role in promoting social justice and equality. **Scheduled Castes (SC)** includes communities that have faced social ostracism and discrimination, historically referred to as Dalits. **Scheduled Tribes (ST)** encompasses indigenous tribes with unique cultural identities, often residing in remote areas. **Other Backward Classes (OBC)** consists of socially and educationally disadvantaged communities that do not fall under SC or ST categories. The Indian government has implemented various policies and reservations in education and employment to uplift these communities, aiming to reduce inequality and promote their socio-economic development. These classifications are integral to ensuring that historically marginalized groups receive the necessary support to improve their living standards and integrate into mainstream society. And OBC candidates, for evolving new policies or modifying existing policy by the State Government and University Grants Commission. To deal with representations received from Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes and OBC candidates regarding their admission, recruitment, promotion and other similar matters in Universities/Affiliated Colleges.

OBJECTIVES OF THE COMMITTEE

- To ensure provisions for an environment where all such students feel safe and secure.
- To ensure compliance of the orders of reservation issued and other benefits admissible from time to time in favor of SC/ST and OBCs
- To ensure protection and reservation as provided in the constitution of India.

- To provide prompt counseling for any emotional emergencies arising on account of any event at the campus.
- To aware the SC/ST students regarding various scholarships program of State Govt.

PLACEMENT ACTIVITIES

Placement training (also known as Campus Recruitment Training) plays a major role in shaping up of careers and honing the skills of students. It is the dream of every engineering student to get placed in a reputed organization that visits their campus for recruitment purpose. Considering this very fact, training has been emphasized to the maximum level as it is important for engineering students to enhance their employability skills and get placed in various organizations / industries.

Currently, the competition for employment is increasing every day and placement has become a challenging task. Training of students and equipping them with life skills has become an important responsibility of the institution. Along with technical expertise, development of a holistic personality is also necessary. To meet out these requirements, a full-fledged training cell is operating in our college to enhance the capabilities of engineering graduates on par with the industry standards.
